Transport Canada published TDG Amendment 6 on February 20, 2008.

What does this mean to you?

- ✓ The changes are effective immediately
- ✓ Subsidiary class numbers must now be displayed on placards
- ✓ Class 3 classification criteria aligns with the UN Recommendations & the GHS
- ✓ UN1005, Anhydrous Ammonia classification changed
- ✓ Infectious Substances risk groups changed to 2 categories
- ✓ Limited Quantity marking allowances
- ✓ UN1075, Liquefied Petroleum Gas - Section 1.32.1 added
- ✓ When using referenced editions you must use the:
 - 14th Revised Edition of the UN Recommendations
 - 2007-2008 ICAO Technical Instructions (Air)
 - 2006 IMDG Code (Sea)
- ✓ Many other changes
